
Market

- A market is set of arrangements by which buyers and sellers are in contact to exchange goods or services; the interaction of demand and supply.
- A market is not a marketplace. A marketplace is a space (physical or virtual) where an exchange could take place.

Market System


The complex web of people, trading structures, and rules that determines how a particular good or service is produced, accessed, and exchanged. It can be thought of as a **network** of market actors, supported by various forms of infrastructure and services, interacting within the context of rules and norms that shape their business environment.

Market System Development/ Programming

Approaches to poverty reduction based on the central idea that the poor are dependent on market systems for their livelihoods. Therefore changing those market systems to work more effectively and sustainably for the poor will improve their livelihoods and consequently reduce poverty.


Why aren't the systems they live within providing solutions?

... How can we work with market actors to change the system to work better for marginalized people

Why does this matter?

- Systemic- instead of quick fixes, it addresses the root causes of exclusion and dysfunction.
- Scalable- large numbers of people benefit from a change in the way the system functions
- Sustainable— the change continues to benefit the target population long after our interventions end.
- Inclusive- because the system changes, anyone can benefit.




Why might a market system not support refugees and IDPs access good jobs? Conventional interventions skip this step




Kenya Markets Trust Results Chain




